The intent of the Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant Program is to take action to reduce the risk of future flooding to structures that are insured through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). For Fiscal Year (FY) 2024, FEMA will distribute up to \$600 million. Project applications must include NFIP insured structures.



## Available Funding

**\$900,000**

per subapplication for project scoping to develop Localized Flood Risk Reduction Projects and/or Individual Flood Mitigation Projects that will subsequently reduce flood claims against the National Flood Insurance Program.

**\$300,000**

per subapplication for additional capability and capacity building activities including Partnership Development, Enhancing Local Floodplain Management, Severe Repetitive Loss /Repetitive Loss Strategy Plan Development, and other eligible C&CB activities.

- ✓ Soil Stabilization

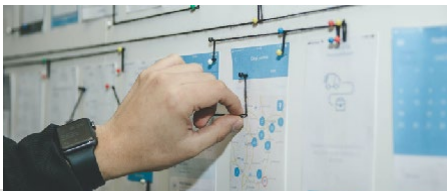


Localized Flood Mitigation Projects

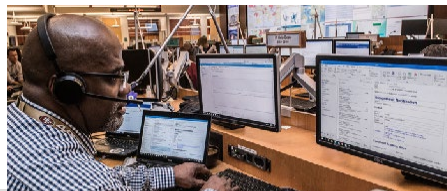
- ✓ Local level drainage/flood control projects to improve drainage and reduce flood risk for communities and can include numerous activities such as drainage pipes, pump stations, topographic grading, seawalls, marsh restoration, and other nature-based solutions



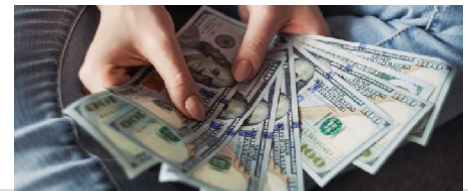
Flood Mitigation Planning Activities

## Additional Eligibility Criteria

- ✓ All subapplicants must be participating in the NFIP, and not be withdrawn, on probation or suspended. Structures identified in the subapplication must have an NFIP policy in effect at the application start date and must maintain it through completion of the mitigation activity and for the life of the structure
- ✓ Subapplicants must have a FEMA-approved Local or Tribal Hazard Mitigation Plan by the application deadline and at the time of obligation of grant funds for mitigation projects (with the exception of mitigation planning)
